





KING UZZIAH ILL Stricken by Leprosy During Temple Service After Infringing on High Priest's Rights

THE OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT
His Majesty is confined to his bed, following a sudden attack of weakness in the Temple yesterday morning. His Majesty is fully conscious, and his life is not in danger.
By order of His Majesty, after consultation with his Council of Ministers and Scribes, the judicial duties of His Majesty will be performed, commencing tomorrow, by his son Jotham. Hearings scheduled for today are hereby postponed until tomorrow.
ROYAL PALACE

Heavy gloom descended yesterday on the Temple, the Palace, and the streets of Jerusalem, when it became known that His Majesty King Uzziah had been afflicted by an incurable malady.

According to unconfirmed reports, the illness from which His Majesty is suffering is a severe leprosy.

The King collapsed in the Temple yesterday morning as he was preparing to bring the incense offering of the Feast of First Fruits — a function reserved by law and custom to the priests. Thousands of shocked worshippers witnessed the incident.

This morning came the official Palace announcement (see box at left) reporting the King's illness — without, however, mentioning its nature — and the appointment of the King's son, Jotham, as Judge of the People.

“Here, the bones of Uzziah, King of Judah, were brought. Do not open.”



Though the throne of Judah was empty, the King of all glory and power who is over all always occupied His throne, enthroned in sovereign authority forever. And in contrast to the weak and leprous king Uzziah, Isaiah saw the true and almighty King.




A structure was built around the walls of the temple containing three levels. The lower chamber was 7.5 feet (2.3 m) wide, the middle chamber was 9 feet (9 m) wide, and the upper chamber was 10.5 feet (3.2 m) wide (1 Kings 6:5-6, 8, 10).

Two ornate wooden doors, overlaid with gold, separated the inner sanctuary from the nave (1 Kings 6:31-32).

The nave had clerestory windows with recessed frames (1 Kings 6:4).

The vestibule was 30 feet (9.1 m) wide and 15 feet (4.6 m) deep (1 Kings 6:3; cf. 2 Chron. 3:4)



The hollow bronze pillar on the north was called "Boaz," and the one on the south was called "Jachin" (1 Kings 7:21; cf. 2 Chron. 3:17).



The bronze altar for burnt offerings was 15 feet (4.6 m) high and 30 feet (9.1 m) long and wide (cf. 2 Chron. 4:1).

The inner sanctuary (or Most Holy Place) was a 30-foot (9.1-m) cube (1 Kings 6:15-29; 2 Chron. 3:8-14). Such rooms were often elevated in temples of the ancient Near East. Two massive golden cherubim were on either side of the ark, each 15 feet (4.6 m) tall with 15-foot (4.6-m) wingspans (1 Kings 6:23-28). The ark of the covenant was between the two cherubim (1 Kings 8:1-11; cf. 2 Chron. 5:2-14).

The nave (or Holy Place) was 60 feet (18.3 m) long and 30 feet (9.1 m) wide (1 Kings 6:15, 17-18; cf. 2 Chron. 3:5-7). It contained the golden altar for incense, the golden table for the bread of the Presence, and ten golden lampstands, five on the north and five on the south (1 Kings 7:48-49; cf. 2 Chron. 4:7).



John 12:37-41 tells us who Isaiah saw: “But though [Christ] had done so many miracles before them, yet they believed not on Him: That the saying of Esaias the prophet might be fulfilled...He hath blinded their eyes, and hardened their heart; that they should not see with their eyes, nor understand with their heart, and be converted, and I should heal them. These things said Esaias, when he saw His [Christ’s] glory, and spake of Him.”

Jesus Christ is Supreme Over All!


Romans 9:5 says of Christ: “...of whom as concerning the flesh Christ came, *who is over all*, God blessed for ever.”



3. With two wings they fly which reveals their obedience and readiness to serve the Lord on the throne.






