Passover

- 1. An ordinance: required of the Jews under the Law*
- 2. An Old Testament ordinance pointing to Israel's deliverance from Egypt*
- 3. Included eating roasted lamb, unleavened bread, bitter herbs*
- 4. Observed strictly once a year*



Lord's Supper

- 1. Never called an ordinance in the Bible, a memorial*
- 2. A New Testament remembrance which points to the Cross*
- 3. Includes only bread and wine*
- 4. Observed as often as each church chooses*



“The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the **communion** of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the **communion** of the body of Christ?
“For we being many are one bread, and one body: for we are all partakers of that one bread” (1 Cor. 10:16,17).



“Ye cannot drink the cup of the Lord, and the cup of devils: ye cannot be partakers of the **Lord's table**, and of the table of devils” (1 Cor. 10:21).
